8-10 year-old children are invited to complete some fun and interactive computer games over video call to help us learn more about children's face perception.

Researchers at the University of Western Australia are looking for children aged 8-10 years to participate in their online face-reading project!

People's faces are amazing! They can tell us things like who a person is, what they are feeling, and how old they are. We also make more subjective evaluations of personality from faces; for example, we form impressions about how trustworthy or intelligent people look. Children are not as good as adults at reading information from faces, and we want to understand how these important face-reading skills develop, as kids get older.

In our study, children are asked to complete some fun and interactive computer games in a two-hour session over video call, and parents are asked to fill in some questionnaires.
